


CHESS EDUCATIONAL DAY FOR SCHOOLS

Dear Headteacher,


I am offering a chess day in schools to link in with the Maths and RE curriculum subjects for junior aged pupils. I offer a flexible day or half day that involves chess teaching and coaching, a mini tournament, a chess quiz and some fun games & icebreakers and a Biblical input that links nine bible characters with the nine chess pieces. I am employed by Face2Face Educational Trust, a Christian Trust that puts on educational projects in schools, clubs and churches in East Anglia.
